

# Leadership Team Guide: Program Family Engagement

## **Family Engagement**

### What is Family Engagement, anyway?

Families are children's first teachers, advocates, and nurturers. When educators work together with families, it contributes to children feeling safe and secure.

#### What's the point?

- Recognizes the family as the expert of their own child. Families know their children in ways no one else does.
- When families are engaged, it strengthens the relationship between families and educators and creates a safe space for families to provide feedback about the program.
- Enhances educators' knowledge about families' diverse cultures and perspectives.
- Promotes educator and family's capacity to support a child's social and emotional needs in both the home setting and the Early Learning and Childcare environment.
- Provides opportunities for educators to work with each family to support individual children's participation and learning.

#### How do I do this?

- Create a welcoming environment for families. Ensure families see themselves reflected in the program (i.e., family photos, cultural artifacts, home language).
- Connect with families on a regular basis and in a variety of ways to build authentic relationships (i.e., face to face, social media, phone calls, emails, etc.).
- Create two-way communication systems with educators and families.
- Develop relationships that are responsive to the uniqueness of each family by seeking to understand their beliefs, values, and priorities for their child's learning.
- Promote family engagement and connection with others (i.e., open house, workshops, family friendly handouts, resources in home language, etc.)
- Learn about and celebrate the ways that families support their children's social and emotional well-being by inviting families to share what works at home.
- Share social emotional resources with families and work together as a team to find strategies to respond to their child's individual needs both at home and in the program.
- Invite families to join the Leadership Team and/or ask for their input on Program Wide goals.

## How can ASaP support you?
